

XXIII. MILITIA ROSTERS, 1812-1815

The following rosters from the War of 1812 were found in the files marked Militia Rosters, Telamon Cuyler Collection, Special Collections, University of Georgia Libraries. These records were discovered by Mary Warren and were published in her Georgia Genealogist magazine. However, the following transcriptions were made from xerox copies of the original rolls.

Such rosters with detailed information on place of birth, age, physical description, etc. are traditional with military units from at least as early as colonial times. However, seldom have such rolls survived as most military establishments have found little or no legal reason for having saved such records, unlike the similar payrolls that although less valuable for research were more often kept. No similar rolls with such personal data are known to have survived for Georgia for the War of 1812. However, such information seems to have survived for the troops recruited in Georgia and elsewhere for the regular U.S. Army during the War of 1812. These records are apparently kept at the National Archives although the staff of the National Archives will not answer request to search these records by mail. ABBREVIATIONS USED

On the following rosters, information is presented for each soldier in the following order:

NAME (PLACE OF BIRTH IF GIVEN) - AGE-HEIGHT-COMPLEXION-HAIR-EYES-PROFFESSION IF GIVEN-VOLUNTEER OR DRAFTED

For example:

Michael Hearden (b. Maddison, Va.)-24-5 ft. 11 3/4 in.fair-(blank)-blue-farmer-volunteer- means that Michael
Hearden was born in Madison, Virginia; is 24 years old; is 5
feet, 11 inches tall; has a fair complexion; (no information is
given about his hair, if any); has blue eyes; and is a farmer
and a volunteer.
